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2. Important Notices

Visa Application (MOST IMPORTANT)

All student visas **MUST** be applied for at a Korean Embassy or Consulate in the student's country of residence **before arriving in Korea.** Our office will provide all prospective students with an Acceptance Package, which will include copies of all necessary documents for applying for a student visa. However, visa requirements may vary by country, so students are strongly advised to contact the Korean Embassy or Consulate in their area to confirm the specific requirements.

Exchange students **MUST** apply for and obtain a D-2-6 student visa **BEFORE** arriving in Korea. **Students SHOULD NOT** enter Korea on a tourist visa or under visa-free tourist conditions, as they will not be able to convert their status to a student visa while in Korea.

Please note :

- The D-2-6 student visa is <u>a single-entry visa</u>, valid for 90 days from the date of issuance.
- Once in Korea, students must apply for a Residence Card (RC), which serves as both an identification card and an entry/exit permit.
- If a student enters Korea using a single-entry visa and <u>leaves</u> the country before receiving their Residence Card (RC), the visa will be automatically INVALIDATED. This means the student will need to apply for a new Certificate of Admission (CoA) and obtain a new visa, which can be time-consuming. Please note that once the semester begins, it will not be possible to issue a new Certificate of Admission.
- If a student FAILS TO apply for Foreign Resident Registration (Residence Card) and leaves the country, their
 D-2-6 visa will be INVALIDATED, requiring a new visa application.

For this reason, students MUST complete their Foreign Resident Registration process as soon as possible after arrival.

Cumulative GPA Confirmation

To accommodate the diverse grading systems of our partner institutions and ensure that students meet the eligibility criteria for the Hanyang University Exchange Program, we require confirmation of each student's Cumulative GPA from their home university.

- The nomination form will include a section where the home university must confirm that the student's Cumulative GPA is above 60% based on their institution's grading system.
- This confirmation must be provided by the home university coordinator to qualify the student for participation in the Hanyang exchange program.

National Health Insurance

Since March 2021, the Korean government has mandated that all long-term foreign residents, including exchange students, must be enrolled in the National Health Insurance (NHI) program after obtaining their Residence Card (RC).

- The monthly NHI fee is approximately 77,000 KRW as of January 2025, but the cost may vary depending on individual circumstances.
- Until students receive their Residence Card, their NHI coverage will not be valid. Therefore, students must still purchase private health insurance to cover unexpected medical issues, including hospitalization.
- Students who qualify for NHI Registration Exemption may apply for exemption individually. Further details on the exemption process will be provided later.

Korean Language Course

Exchange and visiting students at Hanyang University ERICA have two options for Korean language courses. The Survival Korean course is offered by the Institute of International Education (IIE) exclusively for exchange and visiting students, with the tuition fee fully covered by the Office of International Affairs (OIA). The Intensive Korean course, on the other hand, is open to all students, including exchange and visiting students, and requires students to pay the tuition fee. 5. Academic Information —

English Courses

Hanyang University offers approximately 500–600 courses in English each year across various departments. Among these, around 70% are major courses, while 30% are elective courses. Exchange students are generally allowed to take courses from different departments, but course availability is not guaranteed. The most up-to-date course list is released one month before the semester begins. Until then, students should refer to the previous year's course list as a reference (e.g., Fall 2025 applicants should refer to the Fall 2024 course list). However, please note that course offerings may change each year. The previous English-taught course list is available at the following link: <u>Click here</u>.

* Graduate students are also welcome to apply, but they are strongly recommended to take undergraduate-level courses (3rd–4th year), as the number of graduate courses available for exchange students is highly limited.

Credits and Study Load

At Hanyang University, one credit consists of 15 contact hours. In most cases, the conversion to ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) follows the ratio of 1 HYU credit = 2 ECTS. Regular students at Hanyang typically take 15 to 18 credits per semester, with a maximum of 20 credits. Exchange students must enroll in **at least two regular courses** to maintain their visa status.

Course Registration

Before arriving in Korea, exchange students will have the opportunity to register for courses online. Course registration takes place in different phases, categorized by major and year level, and operates on a first-come, first-served basis. The specific registration dates will be sent to students via email and uploaded on our website under the Academic Calendar (Academic Calendar (as of 2025)).

Evaluation and Grade

The evaluation method may vary depending on the professor's policy, but attendance is always an essential part of the grading process. Hanyang University does not offer resit (retake) examinations, meaning that once a final grade is entered into the system, it cannot be changed.

Exchange students are allowed to take only one Pass/Fail (P/F) course per semester, and the majority of courses are graded using the letter grading system. Please refer to the table below for Hanyang's grading scale.

Transcript

In an effort to reduce paperwork and promote eco-friendly practices, Hanyang University ERICA now issues transcripts only in electronic format. Both students and their home university coordinators will receive the e-transcript by the **end of July**. If a hard copy is required, students must contact <u>ericaincoming@hanyang.ac.kr</u>. *Please note: The home university is responsible for covering the postal service fee for hard copy transcripts*. For students attending Hanyang for two (2) consecutive semesters, the transcript will be issued **only after the completion of the second semester** and will be sent via email to both the students and their home university coordinators.

6. Campus Life —

Housing

Exchange students can apply for on-campus dormitories approximately two months before the semester begins. However, dormitory placement is not automatically guaranteed for all applicants. To secure on-campus housing, students must apply during the designated dormitory application period. Housing information is available on the <u>website</u> (available only in Korean).

* Important Notice: Students who <u>fail to complete the housing application or submit the housing fee payment by</u> <u>the deadline will NOT be guaranteed</u> a spot in the dormitory.

Buddy Program

Hanyang's Buddy Program connects exchange and visiting students with current Hanyang students who volunteer to help them adjust to life in Korea. These buddies serve as cultural ambassadors, assisting new students with various aspects of university life and cultural adaptation throughout the semester.
