	Health Insurance Service (NHIS), effective from the date
	of their alien registration (most likely done within 10 days
	into the semester). All will be able to receive equal medical
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	benefits as Korean nationals, receiving automatic discounts
	for doctors' appointments and prescription drugs.
	Exchange students will receive monthly invoices by post, and
	the cost will be approx. 60,000 KRW/month.
