Intensive Learning, Intimate Groups

In a group of no more than 30 students, our expert Tutors will guide you through a deep exploration of your chosen subject area – whether this be Law, Philosophy, Economics, STEM or British Literature. Across the two-week course, you will be intellectually challenged in a way that will build your understanding, stretch your perspectives and grow your academic capabilities.

With a thoughtfully balanced schedule, you'll attend classes either in the morning or the afternoon, providing space in your day to explore everything

Our Academic Programme

We offer 16 different courses across five different streams (areas of study), namely International & European Law, Economics, Philosophy, British Literature and STEM.

Each of the streams is led by a senior academic of Oriel College who sits on the Institute's Academic Advisory Panel (see page 6). They work with the Tutors to ensure that the learning experience delivered is truly world-class and meets the highest of academic standards, while remaining accessible.

The Tutors who teach at the Summer Institute are drawn either directly from Oriel or from the wider University. Some of the Advisory Panel members will also teach on the programme. This ensures

that the quality of the programme, both in terms of content and teaching, is maintained at the highest level.

Each student may take one course per session but must select up to three preferences in order of priority. While we will do our best to place you in your first-choice programme, limited spaces mean this cannot always be guaranteed. To increase your chances of securing a place, we recommend that you submit your application as early as possible.

Recognising your Learning

The Summer Institute is first and foremost an academic programme. While we promise to provide outstanding teaching, we expect our students to engage fully, work hard and make the most of the experience.

Both during the course and at the end of the second week, your tutor will assess your understanding of the course's content. The specific mode of assessment will depend on the course you are undertaking, but might include group presentations, essays, multiple choice tests, seminar feedback.

Each delegate who has successfully completed the programme will receive a Certificate of Achievement from Oriel College, as well as an Official Academic Transcript.

The Certificate of Achievement will be signed by the Senior Tutor and Senior Dean of Oriel College, and the transcript will set out how you performed in your learning and participation in the programme.

Some universities will accept this course as credit towards your degree – please check with your home university when you apply. For reference, this programme includes approximately 36 hours of teaching - this is typically considered to be 2 US credit hours/4 ECTS credits.

Our standard fee package includes:

- **Application fee:** A 500 GBP non-refundable application fee

- **Tuition:** for the duration of your programme, including all course teaching, evening lectures and assessments

- **Activities:** Transport to weekend excursions and various activities in Oxford city

- **Accommodation:** Pricing is based on single ensuite rooms. Dependent on availability, discounts can be provided for single standard and twin shared room options

- **Food:** Breakfast, lunch and dinner on weekdays. Breakfast only on weekends. Welcome reception and Farewell Formal Hall meal.





Discounts

Early Bird Discount (100 GBP) is available for those who complete their applications and payments earlier than 1 Mar 2025.

Students applying from non-partner universities are eligible for one of the following discounts:

- **Word of Mouth Discount (200 GBP)** is available for those who are recommended by previous participants of the Summer Institute.
- **Group Discount (200 GBP)** is available for students enrolling in groups of three or more, making it an excellent choice for friends or classmates to join together.

How to apply

The Summer Institute warmly welcomes applications from talented and ambitious students (aged 18 or above) from universities and colleges anywhere in the world. Working professionals seeking further education are also welcome to apply.

We run a rolling admissions process, meaning that we assess and admit candidates as applications are received. We have a strictly limited number of places for each course, so you are encouraged to submit your application as soon as possible. We encourage students to submit their application no later than 1 April, although we may still accept applications past this date.

Language requirements

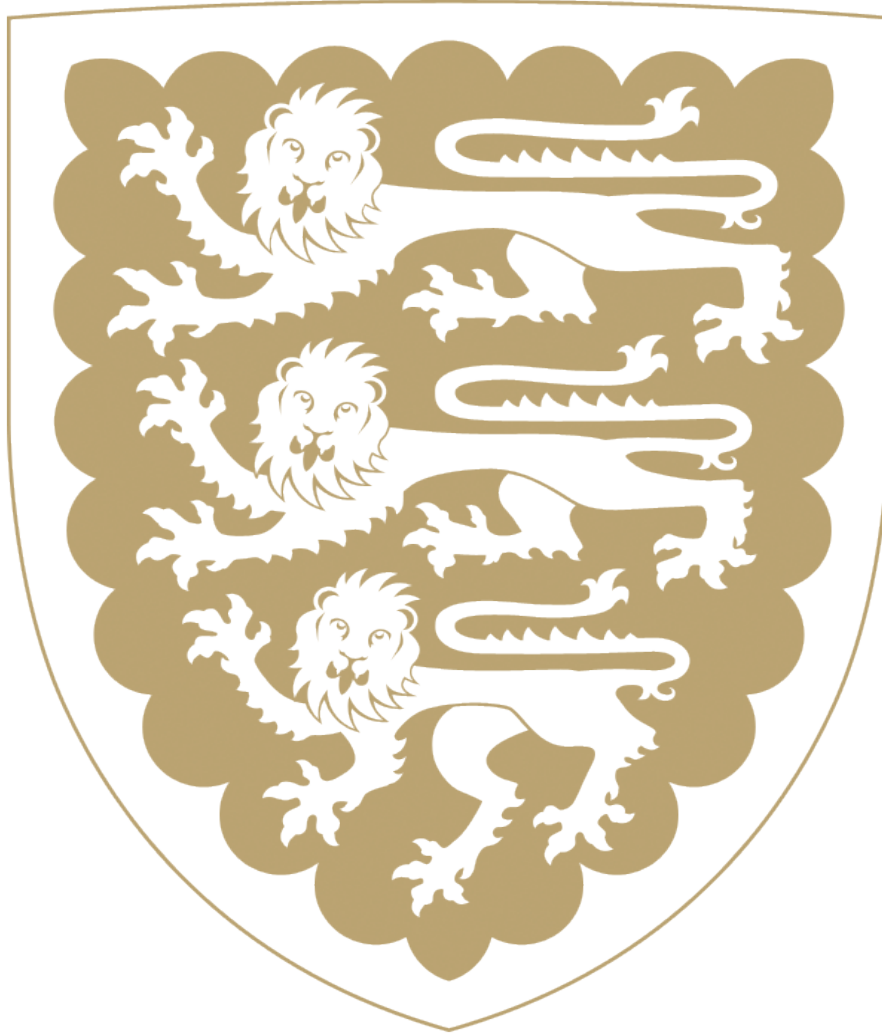
To ensure participants can fully engage with the academic and cultural

experience, the Summer Institute requires a strong level of English language proficiency. Applicants should demonstrate their proficiency with a minimum IELTS score of 6.5 or a TOEFL score of 90 or equivalent.

These standards ensure that students can actively participate in lectures, discussions and workshops, while also fully enjoying the immersive environment of studying at Oriel College, University of Oxford. If you meet these language requirements, you will be well-prepared to thrive in this intellectually stimulating programme.
